

# Changes to the Interdisciplinary Simulation Sessions planned for Fall 2020



## Change Based on Feedback & Social Distancing

Based on feedback from prior simulation sessions and our efforts to limit the number of participants to promote social distancing, our Interdisciplinary Simulation Sessions will look different this fall.

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## Shorter Sessions

Sessions will be shorter – typically between 45 mins to 1 hour.

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## Availability and Scheduling

Most sessions will take place on Thursday mornings. Some sessions will be planned to take place on our physical units, some will still take place in COGS. We will offer a limited number of sessions on evening shifts. Division Directors, Nursing Leadership and Administrative Assistants will work with providers and nurses to ensure everyone is assigned a session. A limited number of make-up sessions will be offered as well as the option to participate in the sessions at Highland Hospital.

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## Independent Pre-Work

The required pre-learning will be completed independently online using MyPath. Both the pre-learning and participation in an interdisciplinary simulation session are required to qualify for the malpractice reduction.

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## Mask Up

All participants will be required to wear a mask throughout their simulated patient experience and the team debrief.

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## Requirement

All obstetric providers and obstetric nurses are required to participate in an annual simulation session. Our malpractice insurer (MCIC) continues to support our efforts by offering malpractice insurance reduction.
